OUR CHALLENGE

The 2020 DC Point-in-Time count, which took place on January 22, totaled 2,433 people in 768 homeless families, including 1,422 children.

As COVID-19 continues to devastate our community and add more financial stress on families, we know the need for safe, affordable housing and homeless services will only grow in the years to come.



The District of Columbia continues to have the highest rate of homelessness in the country at 94 people per every 10,000. This is more than double the rate of New York's homeless population, the second highest in the United States.



African American and Black individuals are disproportionately affected by the drivers of homelessness. More than 86% of adults experiencing homelessness in DC are Black or African American, yet they comprise 46.6% of the District's population.

OUR IMPACT

Thanks to our generous supporters and partners, Housing Up remains an integral part of ending family homelessness in the District. With the powerful combination of safe, affordable housing and supportive services, the families we serve are able to transform their lives.

IN 2019...



96% of rapid re-housing and permanent supportive housing families maintained stable housing.



We served nearly 1,000 youth in our programs.



We provided a total of 372 affordable housing units, with 290 units in our pipeline.



70 percent of youth involved in our youth enrichment programs maintained above average grades.

MIRIAM GARCIA
& FAMILY



In moving to the United States from the Dominican Republic, Miriam Garcia imagined a life in the U.S. far better than the one she left. Unfortunately, while pregnant with her daughter, her ex-husband abused her and eventually kicked her and her mother out of their house. Pregnant, with an elderly mother and a limited command of the English language, Ms. Garcia moved from house to house as she attempted to figure out a permanent solution.

Since moving into Fort View in 2011, Ms. Garcia has been able to maintain housing for her family and transition to full-time work as a federal contractor at the Department of Agriculture and Department of Energy. The Garcia family is also deeply involved in the Fort View community, often mainstays at Resident Services events throughout the year.

Even with all her responsibilities, Ms. Garcia still makes time for others. At the beginning of the pandemic, Ms. Garcia helped communicate the needs and fears of Fort View's Spanish-speaking families – particularly those that are undocumented – to Resident Services, ensuring that essential resources and information were accessible to all.

Ms. Garcia, now a US citizen, is a domestic violence survivor and the main caretaker for her daughter and mother. She has not only made it through impossible circumstances, but she has been able to thrive because of affordable housing.


ASIA KYLE & FAMILY



In 2015, Asia Kyle came to Housing Up through the Polaris Project, a nonprofit that works to rehabilitate human trafficking survivors. Since moving into Webster Gardens five years ago, Ms. Kyle has become a strong advocate for human trafficking survivors, pursuing justice for them and advocating against exploitation.

Ms. Kyle is an Advocacy Lab Leader with Karana Rising, volunteering her time to support youth survivors of human trafficking in reaching their fullest potential. Through this work, Ms. Kyle has testified before the Congressional Women's Caucus and was a leading survivor voice in Karana's Rising's national campaign to stop online sex trafficking on Craigslist and Backpage.com.

She is now working to educate lawmakers and the public on policies that will lead to clemency for survivors of human trafficking who were arrested or incarcerated because of their trafficking. Ms. Kyle is the mother of a four year-old daughter and is a licensed cosmologist. Having stable housing has allowed Ms. Kyle to delve into the important work of survivor justice, pursue professional goals, create a support system, and ensure that her daughter has a solid foundation to grow.
